
Blackbutt needs a new Police Station

"The building itself is decrepit, tiny and no longer fit-for-purpose," Deb said.

Meaning in Life, Rev Chris Downes, Murgon District Baptist Church

In reading an article by Denis Prager in stream.org (When Banks — And Other Institutions — Try to Change the World) he makes the following statements

Beginning in the second half of the 20th century, people in nearly every white-collar profession ceased finding their work inherently meaningful. So, they sought to use their profession to change the world.

Take journalism. For most of American history, reporters understood that their primary job was to report news. And for the most part, reporters believed that was important work. In the second half of the 20th century, more and more of them found reporting the news unexciting and meaningless. So, they sought to use journalism to change the world.

Sports writers are one such example.. They decided that merely writing about sports was not particularly significant work. So, they decided to use their profession to change the world. It was sports writers who led the idiotic campaign to drop the name "Redskins" from the Washington NFL team — even though the name was adopted as an honorific (no one names their team for an insult) and even though the vast majority of Native Americans, according to

The Washington Post itself, could not care less about the issue.


One reason is the loss of meaning in our secular society. Whereas in the past people derived meaning in life from their religion — their religious community, religious sources of meaning have begun to disappear from our secular society. And secularism is rapidly leading to the collapse of the other great source of meaning in people's lives: marriage and family, Therefore, one has had to look elsewhere for meaning. And where do people look? To career and political activism — and ideally, the merger of the two. Whereas in the past, one's work was primarily regarded as a means to an end — namely, a way to provide for one's family — today, work is an end in itself.

The Westminster confession says 'The chief end of man is to Glorify God and enjoy him forever". God the creator said that it is not good for man to be alone so he created families.

We in the west live in societies that are more materially wealthy than ever, have access to more knowledge than ever. and have better medical skills than ever. but the rise in depression and anxiety is massive.

When people are deriving meaning from helping some "poor, hurting person" at a distance they are not bearing the cost or having the feedback mechanism to see if it is working. When you are serving God in community God and the wise people in the community are helping guide the process. When you are serving family the results are what you are living with so it has corrective factors. Yes religion and family have had their faults and mistakes that is why God said we need forgiveness and Grace. But taking God out and serving self not family is not immune from mistakes. All religions and families are not equal, they need to be held to the standard of truth and love, Do they fit realty when we are honest with our selves and do they act in kindness to the variety of people involved over both short and long term. Christianity's core values are Love, Truth and Forgiveness and although it does not perfect them it goes badly when we do not follow and seek them.

Gympie residents – Have your say on land valuations

Member for Nanango, Deb Frecklington is calling on Nanango Electorate residents who own property in the western part of the Gympie region to check newly released land valuations.

Deb said the Gympie region is one of 24 local government areas across Queensland which are part of the annual land valuation program in 2023.

"I urge landowners to carefully review their valuation notice when it arrives in the mail and consider if they should lodge an objection against their new valuation by the closing date of 16 May 2023," Deb said.

"The new valuations should reflect the property market on 1st October 2022, the date of the valuation undertaken by the Department of Resources."

"The Gympie region has seen 49.1% valuation increase in Primary Production land in the latest review and a 42.5% increase for Rural Residential land.

"All of our townships have also seen increases including:

Kilkivan - 60.7% Goomeri - 29.1 % Tansey - 45.4% Woolooga - 10.3%

"Land valuations are the basis for rating, land tax and state land rental purposes and the new valuations will take effect from 30th June 2023.

"If you believe your land valuation may be incorrect, I would encourage landholders to lodge an objection. I am aware of some landholders who have saved on their local government rate bills by successfully objecting to an incorrect valuation.

"Objections must be lodged within 60 days from the date of issue and no later than 16 May 2023, with forms found online at www.qld.gov.au/landvaluation, or by calling 1300 664 217," Deb said.

Members of the Barambah Garden Club gathered together on 10th March for a meeting held at the home of Margaret Mitchell at 12 Arnell Street Murgon.

Morning Tea was served at 9.30 am followed by the monthly meeting.

Guest Speaker for the Day was Damien O'Sullivan, Agriculture Extension Officer in Kingaroy. Damien spoke to the members about poisons, targeting Roundup, the brand name of a broad-spectrum glyphosate-based herbicide. Farmers and gardeners are well acquainted with the product.

Roundup is the world's best-selling weed killer. The manufacturer Bayer introduced it to the market in 1978 and does not consider it an acute toxicity hazard. Research reveals it has an oral toxicity similar to vitamin A and is less toxic than aspirin. However there is evidence that human cancer risk might increase as a result of occupational exposure to large amounts of glyphosate, such as agricultural work, but no good evidence of such a risk from home use, such as in domestic gardening.

Damien advised members to wear protective clothing when using the potent product and also gave advice on the best method to poison Lantana which can be a curse for many land owners.

Noting the fact that we have had very dry weather, the Garden Club Competition Table was well represented with a display of colourful blooms.

Gympie residents – Have your say on land valuations

Member for Nanango, Deb Frecklington is calling on Nanango Electorate residents who own property in the western part of the Gympie region to check newly released land valuations.

Deb said the Gympie region is one of 24 local government areas across Queensland which are part of the annual land valuation program in 2023.

"I urge landowners to carefully review their valuation notice when it arrives in the mail and consider if they should lodge an objection against their new valuation by the closing date of 16 May 2023," Deb said.

"The new valuations should reflect the property market on 1st October 2022, the date of the valuation undertaken by the Department of Resources."

"The Gympie region has seen 49.1% valuation increase in Primary Production land in the latest review and a 42.5% increase for Rural Residential land.


"All of our townships have also seen increases including:

Kilkivan - 60.7% Goomeri - 29.1 % Tansey - 45.4% Woolooga - 10.3%

"Land valuations are the basis for rating, land tax and state land rental purposes and the new valuations will take effect from 30th June 2023.

"If you believe your land valuation may be incorrect, I would encourage landholders to lodge an objection. I am aware of some landholders who have saved on their local government rate bills by successfully objecting to an incorrect valuation.

"Objections must be lodged within 60 days from the date of issue and no later than 16 May 2023, with forms found online at www.qld.gov.au/landvaluation, or by calling 1300 664 217," Deb said.

The Australian Early Development Census (AEDC) is a nationwide census of early childhood development at the time children commence their first year of full-time school.

Results on the AEDC reflect how well children and families are supported from conception through to school age. I have enclosed the Community Profile 2021 – South Burnett for your information.

You will see that our children are starting school already behind, with almost one in three children developmentally vulnerable (compared to the Queensland average of 24.7% and the Australian average of 22%). These results tell us that we need to come together as a community to work together on priorities and changes that will make a difference for all of our South Burnett children.

The South Burnett Regional Council and the South Burnett Partnerships 4 Kids will be hosting community forums across the South Burnett in March and April to discuss how to help South Burnett children reach their potential.





Wild Dog & Feral Pig Control Program

South Burnett Regional Council is conducting a coordinated Wild Dog & Feral Pig Control Program. Wild dogs cause livestock losses and kill native fauna. Feral pigs are key spread vectors for emergency animal diseases such as Foot and Mouth and African Swine Fever which are now in close proximity to the Australian mainland. Participation in this coordinated program will assist in suppressing the feral pig population across a more extensive area of our region.

To encourage greater participation, the South Burnett Regional Council will be providing meat free of charge for landholders that register to participate in the coordinated program.

Baiting stations will be held throughout the South Burnett from 3 May 2023 to 11 May 2023. All participants must **register their intention** to conduct baiting no later than Thursday 20 April 2023.

Protection of domestic and working dogs

Owners of domestic and working dogs are advised to restrain and or muzzle their dogs during the baiting program to minimise the risk of dogs wandering and coming into contact with poison baits.



Kindy now delivered at Kumbia School

Member for Nanango, Deb Frecklington has congratulated Kumbia State School on a successful first Term of delivering a brand-new Kindy program now based at the primary school.

Deb said she was pleased to advocate on behalf of the community to secure the new Kindy program for Kumbia families.

"In July last year I met with members of the Kumbia Kindy Committee and Kumbia Principal Mr Sutton to discuss the possibility of merging the Kindy with the School," Deb said.

"They were seeking a solution to the problem of keeping their small community-controlled Kindy facility operational, and the idea of integrating the Kindy with the School, similar to what had been achieved at Bell State School was suggested.

"The families also shared the importance of retaining kindergarten services in their township, explaining that if the Kindy closed down it would mean a one hour round trip to Kingaroy to access Kindergarten.

"The flow-on effects would mean that families would have been more likely to transfer their older children to school in in Kingaroy, rather than remaining at Kumbia State School.

"I was pleased to advocate on their behalf and spoke directly to the Minister for Education to put this practical proposal forward.

"It is fantastic to see this idea come to fruition for our kindy kids and their families and to learn that the first Term of this service has been very successful.

"I recently visited Kumbia State School to present the new school leaders with their badges and it was great to hear the new Kindy program has got off to a great start," Deb said.

Removal of Application Fee for Roadside Burning and Clearing Applications

South Burnett Regional Council advises at the February Ordinary Meeting of Council, it was resolved to remove the application fee of sixty dollars for the fence line clearing and roadside burning applications.

The removal of the fee is seen as a way of encouraging more applications to Council and acknowledges the benefits of maintaining and enhancing Council's Road reserves by landowners.

"I encourage the public, to still be diligent and contact the relevant people and parties before lighting any fires" Cr Henschen said.

The requirement to lodge an application with Council will still be required, although the fee will no longer be applicable for the following applications:

- Application to Clear Vegetation on a Rural Road Reserve or Other Council Controlled Reserve
- Application to Burn a Rural Road Reserve or Other Council Controlled Reserve

O'BRIEN WELCOMES BRUCE'S FOUR LANE BACKFLIP ON BRUCE HIGHWAY

Federal Member for Wide Bay Llew O'Brien has welcomed a backflip by the Queensland Assistant Minister for Regional Roads, Bruce Saunders, who now says the Bruce Highway between Gympie and Maryborough must be four laned.

Speaking in Gympie on Friday, 24 March, about the Bruce Highway from Gympie to Maryborough, Mr Saunders told local media, 'it's time that we get the four lanes through right now.'

Communities take action on transmission line corridors

During December and January, communities in the northern, eastern and central parts of the Nanango Electorate were faced with the State Government's announcement that electricity transmission line corridors may be built through their region. There are six proposed corridors that have been proposed to connect the proposed Borumba Dam Pumped Hydro Project to the Woolooga Substation in the north and the Tarong/Halys substations in the south. One corridor in either direction will be chosen and residents have spent many anxious nights wondering if their rural homes, businesses and properties will end up being in the path of these massive new 500 kilovolt lines.

On behalf of my community I wrote to the Minister for Energy asking for an extension to the consultation period. A small extension has been granted until 31 March (for consultation) and the release date for the chosen corridor now 27th April. During Parliament this week I spoke on this issue in support of my community. I have also tabled a Question on Notice, and sponsored a petition. I back my community's call for state-owned land to be the first choice for the corridors and that all available technology and infrastructure is used to minimise the impact on private landowners, the environment and on traditional owners.




