Payments may still be received in person at Nanango, Kingaroy, Murgon, Wondai, Proston & Blackbutt Customer Service Centres by EFTPOS, Visa, Mastercard, cash or cheque. Payments can also be made through Australia Post and via BPay.

Discount will be applied to properties where the full amount owing (net payable) has been received over the counter or into Council's bank account on or before Monday 22 April 2024.

Please ensure electronic transfers are received into Council's account before the close of discount date. For BPAY transfers allow up to three days for transfer into Council's account. Please contact your financial institution directly regarding internet banking and transfer cut-off times.

Changes to Bin Collections



BOOST TO PAYMENTS FOR WIDE BAY PENSIONERS

More than 45,000 people in Wide Bay will benefit from a boost to their social security payments from 20 March, Federal Member for Wide Bay Llew O'Brien advised today.

People receiving the Age Pension, Disability Support Pension, and Carer Payment will receive an increase of \$19.60 per fortnight for singles, and \$29.40 per fortnight for couples combined.

The maximum fortnightly pension rate including supplements will increase to \$1682.80 for couples and \$1116.30 for singles.

"Wide Bay residents are experiencing significant cost of living increases, and this rise will provide some small relief to pensioners and people receiving income support," Mr O'Brien said.

"People are struggling to pay for their groceries and find the money for their skyrocketing energy bills. Rents are soaring and we have now seen 10 consecutive interest rate raises under the Albanese Labor Government."

Jobseeker and ABSTUDY payments have also increased, with single Jobseeker and ABSTUDY recipients aged

over 22 receiving an additional \$13.50 per fortnight, and single parents who receive Parenting Payment will have an additional \$17.50 each fortnight.

Social Security payments are indexed twice a year to help with the rising cost of living. The next increase will occur on 20 September 2024.

"Cost of living pressures will be made even worse if the Albanese Government's proposal to impose another biosecurity tax on farmers goes ahead," Mr O'Brien said.

"Labor's Biodiversity Protection Levy is expected to collect around \$50 million each year over the next three years, and this is a tax that will be passed from farmers to wholesalers and retailers, and onto consumers.

Mr O'Brien said a range of factors could affect Age Pension payments, including the income and asset tests, deeming rates, and other provisions.

"Every year I publish an Age Pension Guide to ensure Wide Bay pensioners have access to up-to-date information that is clear and easy to understand," Mr O'Brien said.

Eligible Queensland-based organisations can apply for funding of up to \$25,000.

Pathology Queensland Toowoomba Laboratory celebrates remarkable milestone



Supporting communities across the Darling Downs and South Burnett, the Pathology Queensland Toowoomba Laboratory is celebrating its centenary. The Toowoomba laboratory was the fourth laboratory to be opened in Australia after Rabaul (Papua New Guinea), Bendigo and Townsville and commenced operation in December 1923.

Group Laboratory Manager, Neil Dawson said Toowoomba was the first inland laboratory to be set up in Queensland. "We are one of the very few laboratories that have a hundred-year continuous operating history and quite a well-documented history at that.

"In the 1920's, pathology laboratories were mainly set up in conjunction with quarantine ports to deal with containing epidemics and quarantining overseas ships.

"It was far from a laboratory like we'd recognise today, with just a few basic tests on offer, compare this to present day where the laboratory operates 24/7 and conducts thousands of tests each day.

"Pathology plays an essential role in healthcare, it's commonly quoted that 70 per cent of clinical decisions made in the health system are made using pathology as the source of evidence," Mr Dawson said.

For over 42 of those years, Scientist Warwick Anderson has been working in the Toowoomba laboratory.

"I started in December 1981. One of the biggest changes I've experienced over this time would be computerisation. Previously, everything was handwritten, and carbon copied. It was very hard to look back on patient files. You had to try to remember a patient's history to know if a result was keeping with what they were last time.

"For the volume of work we complete, we certainly need technological advancements like the automation of machinery. Back when I started, every specimen went through your hands several times to get it all done.

"Turnaround times have improved, for example, a thyroid function test you had to wait a week for a result to come back, now it's just a routine test, and you get results back within an hour or two.

"I wonder what it will be like in another 40 years," Mr Anderson said.

Murgon Cattle Sale Report 05/03/2024



Numbers increase to 1000 in Murgon yesterday for the fortnightly sale. In line with all other selling centres all lines of cattle eased in price with lighter heifers seeing the largest decline. Heavy Bulls sold to \$2.56 per kilogram and \$2300.00. Approximately 230 Cows were yarded with Cows over 500 kilograms selling to \$2.20 per kilogram and \$2026.00 for an average of \$2.21 per kilogram. Cows 400 to 500 kg topped at \$2.10 per kilogram for \$992.00. Cows under 400 kg topped at \$1.89c/kg, averaging \$1.59 c/kg. Export heifers sold to \$2.37 per kilogram for \$1293.00. Cattle were drawn from Mundubbera, Gayndah, Durong, Yarraman, Nanango, Kingaroy, Kilkivan, & locally. 500 kg Crossbred steers from Cushnie sold for \$3.24 c/kg returning \$1629.00. Santa steers from Byee weighing 389 kg sold for \$3.16 c/kg for \$1230.00. A line of Santa steers from Mundubbera averaging 289kg sold to a top of \$3.52 c/kg & \$1022.00. 240 kg Charolais cross steers from Proston sold for \$853.00 at \$3.54 c/kg. Local Santa cross weaners steers sold for \$3.38 c/kg& \$977.00. Charbray weaner steers sold \$3.88 c/kg to return \$826.00. Simmental cross weaner steers from Tansey sold for \$3.34 c/kg and \$779.00. Santa heifers weighing 363 kg sold for \$930.00 at \$2.56 c/kg. 305 kg Santa heifers from Hivesville sold for \$779.00 at \$2.56 c/kg. 3 pens of Brangus heifers from Gayndah sold for \$2.84 c/kg returning an average of \$744.00. Charolais cross weaner heifers sold for \$686.00 at \$2.40 c/kg. There was a number of Cows and Calves yarded and sold out to a top of \$1240.00.




Did you know that it has been over a year since the South Burnett started the recycling program?

Over the past year we have diverted over 1083.25 tonne of waste from going into landfill. Out of all the waste collected from the kerbside collections, this is only 12.18%. A study in 2021 shows that 32% of household waste is recyclable, meaning the South Burnett still has so much more recycling to do!



Update - Wondai CBD Footpath and Roundabout Upgrade

South Burnett Regional Council is pleased to provide this update on the Wondai CBD Footpath Upgrade Project.

The project will revitalise the Scott Street commercial precinct with new infrastructure that includes stormwater, kerb and channel, exposed aggregate concrete footpath areas, bike racks and pedestrian seating.

The project commenced on Monday 12 February 2024 along the eastern side of Scott Street, between Edward and Haly Streets. The initial works focused on the site establishment, traffic management controls and preparation works for modification to shop awnings that included the removal of existing kerb and channel and part of the existing footpath.

Following these initial works, Council's engaged qualified builder commenced works on the modifications to the existing shop awning posts that also included the installation of new concrete footings. During these modification works, it was deemed unsafe for Council staff and contractors to work with the area until the builder had completed these works and subsequently redeployed to other projects.

Council is now in the process of identifying and locating services on site with the intent for works to be completed over the coming weeks, including the pouring of the trial slabs for exposed aggregate footpath surface, commencement of trenching and installation of stormwater pipes and components.

Construction activity will create noise from machinery and equipment, some restrictions to vehicle parking and pedestrian access for public safety, however these impacts will be limited and allow for continual business access as construction progresses along Scott Street.

Site works and construction activity will be performed Monday to Friday – 6:00am to 4:00pm with occasional weekend work. The project is expected to be completed by early May 2024.

This project has been proudly funded by the Queensland Government's 2021-2024 Works for Queensland Program in association with the South Burnett Regional Council Capital Works Program for 2023-2024.



BARAMBAH GARDEN CLUB



Members of the Barambah Garden Club held their monthly meeting on Friday 9th February at the home of Mary Mitchell. A lovely morning tea was served, and the Competition Table was prepared for the various sections of flowers, herbs, natives, vegetables, etcetera. Later, voting would take place.

The guest speaker for the meeting was one of the members, Joy Thomson. She introduced and demonstrated an age-old art form which works well with wildflowers and other suitable foliage. One could say it is more of a photographic development procedure using the Cyanotype process. In photography, this low-cost, simple process was often used for making proofs instead of finished prints. They were called blueprints.

This is a brief description of Joy's demonstration. In a dark corner of the room, she coated strips of calico with the Cyanotype solution. The chosen foliage, the wildflowers, leaves or petals of choice were arranged on the calico in a decorative design. These strips were then covered in glass and moved outside into the sun where the magic happened. The colour changed rapidly and after about five minutes was a beautiful blue colour. A rinse took place for the final process. The result could be a wall hanging or a shopping bag with a nature sun print - a beautiful piece of art. Suitable paper could also be used, depending on the desired result or purpose. Joy stressed the fact that it is an art that improves with practice.

The morning was very successful with such an interesting topic and another way to be creative, especially using flowers and foliage. Joy was thanked for sharing her knowledge.

The meeting included a discussion on various locations for trips to enhance our appreciation of tending and cultivating a garden and learning more about plants.

Wild Dog & Feral Pig Control Program

South Burnett Regional Council is conducting a coordinated Wild Dog & Feral Pig Control Program. Wild dogs cause livestock losses and kill native fauna. Feral pigs are key spread vectors for emergency animal diseases such as Foot and Mouth and African Swine Fever which are now in close proximity to the Australian mainland. Participation in this



coordinated program will assist in suppressing the feral pig population across a more extensive area of our region.

To encourage greater participation, the South Burnett Regional Council will be providing meat free of charge for landholders that register to participate in the coordinated program.

Baiting stations will be held throughout the South Burnett from Friday 10 May 2024 to Friday 17 May 2024. All participants must register their intention to conduct baiting no later than Thursday 2 May 2024.

For further information and to register your intention of attending a baiting station please contact Council's Stock Route & Pest Officer on (07) 4189 9100.

Protection of domestic and working dogs

Owners of domestic and working dogs are advised to restrain and or muzzle their dogs during the baiting program to minimise the risk of dogs wandering and coming into contact with poison baits.

Further Pest Management Assistance available through South Burnett Regional Council includes:

Feral Animal Control

Free Trap Hire

Council have a range of traps available for hire free of charge to landholders to assist in the control of wild dogs, pigs, rabbits, cats and foxes.

Surveillance Cameras

Cameras are available for hire free of charge to monitor feral animal movements to assist in determining the best location to set traps or lay baits.

Pig Baiting Stations

Known as hog hoppers, these baiting stations specifically target pigs featuring an opening mechanism that can only be opened by animals with a snout. The stations are used in conjunction with pig out baits, a pre-packaged 1080 bait which can also be purchased from Council.

Property inspections and advice

Officers are available to provide onsite advice on how to manage feral animal and weed issues.

1080 Baiting Program

Council delivers two coordinated baiting programs throughout the year to encourage eligible landholders to bait across the region. Programs are held in May and September to control wild dog and feral pigs. Individual baiting can also be requested outside of these times. Eligibility requirements do change, we encourage landholders to contact Council regarding their eligibility to bait.

Calici Virus

Officers are available to assist with trapping and injection of Calici Virus to manage rabbit populations.

Weed Control

Access to spray equipment (splatter guns, spray trailer, tree spears etc.)

Herbicide assistance and coordinated treatment programs (when available)

Treatment advice and individual property inspections

Mapping and identification of pests

GRAHAM HOUSE COMMUNITY CENTRE TRIBUTE TO COL SIPPEL



Col Sippel significantly contributed to the establishment of the Graham House Community Centre, a location deeply cherished by him, given his roots as a native born at the Graham House Maternity Hospital on May 29, 1928.

In 1988, Col, who was a member of council, and a group of citizens, many of whom were also a part of the North Country Deanery of the Catholic Church, became concerned with the lack of services and information available to the community in the South Burnett.

At the time of identifying this need, the South Burnett Community Development Program were offering funding specifically for improving services in rural/remote communities. The North Country Deanery of the Catholic Church applied, becoming successful, and were offered the original Graham House Maternity Hospital building by the Department of

Childrens Services and Aboriginal Affairs. This building became known as the Graham House Community Centre. Graham House Community Centre went on to become an incorporated association in 1992.

A Board was formed for the management of Graham House Community Centre. Col served as President from 1989 to 2013 and continued as Vice President from 2013 to 2020, making Col's time with us 31 years. Col was honoured a Lifetime Membership with our Board to acknowledge his time and commitment to Graham House Community Centre.

Lauren, Graham House Community Centres Community Access and Development Worker, who recalls working closely with Col for many years said "Col was always a kind, happy man. He would come to the Centre to sign cheques for our accounts on a weekly basis and to just check in on the staff. He loved attending our yearly Christmas Parties and was always available for a chat when I saw him down the street. He will be greatly missed."

Graham House Community Centre staff, Board members and volunteers, past and present, would like to pay tribute to Col Sippel for his contribution to making the Centre and the South Burnett what it is today. Our 2024 vision statement "A connected, liveable and diverse community" is one we think Col would be proud of and is exactly what he was committed to achieving all those years ago.

Rest In Peace Col, you created a long-lasting legacy in Graham House Community Centre through your positive impact, you shall continue to be our inspiring force.

Borumba TAG-A-TOGA Fishing for Knowledge



63 anglers converged on Lake Borumba near Imbil Qld for the ninth annual TAG-A-TOGA event on 1-3 rd March for a lot of fun and to gain a better understanding of the resident Saratoga population. Rather than a normal fishing competition, this event offers a more relaxed environment which focuses heavily on everyone enjoying themselves rather than who wins. There are a lot of great prizes given away for hidden treasures and lucky door prizes with only a few reserved for those who catch fish.

This year the 26 teams were again all filled without any advertising, TAGATOGA popularity continues to rise. This was the eighth year Kingaroy Sportfishing Club had held the event at this time of year and the data collected is very detailed including what lure / bait, time of capture, and terrain where each fish was caught. At event closure, this data is shared with entrants to help fine tune angler's skills to have better success chasing these mighty fish, Brendan Moore from Kingaroy Sportfishing Club advised.

Although they possess very poor eating qualities, Saratoga are renowned for their willingness to take both lures and flies and their acrobatic performances once hooked, which has made them a premier freshwater sports fish. Saratoga are prehistoric, surviving since the Eocene era which is around 50 million years ago, their upward facing eyes making them a target for surfacepresentations, however their hard bony mouths make hooking and landing them challenging.

"The fishing was the most successful on record with a total of 131 Saratoga caught. All of these fish were released and most tagged with QLD Sportfishers pink tags. This will allow us to learn more about these ancient looking creatures.

The longest Saratoga captured during the weekend was a magnificent 780mm model caught by Barry McArthur who was also fishing with his son, highlighting the family friendly aspect of the event. Fish of this size are very crafty and landing one of these are a testament to the anglers ability. This was also backed up with a 770mm model caught on lure by Sam King. Credit goes to both Kingaroy Sportfishing Club and the anglers who fished the event for having fun and contributing to a greater understanding of a highly regarded sportfish. A captured size range of 210mm to 780mm proved that 30

there was a good self-sufficient breeding process under way within the area as well as the larger size range proving their living conditionswere well suited to their lifestyle and general health.

"If you haven't been to Borumba dam, do yourself a favour, it's a picturesque dam that's full of fish, thanks to the great work of the dedicated local stocking group" event organiser Bob Dover stated. "Nontarget species, namely Australian Bass and Golden Perch were also encountered, and data recorded before being returned to the water ready to fight another dayShaun Manthey thanked all participants who travelled and the staff at Borumba Deer Park for thevenue and hospitality. BCF, Garmin Australia, Sunshine Mitre 10, Australian Freshwater Fishing Charters and Borumba Deer Park all sponsored this event and made it the success it was. The Kingaroy Sportfishing Club offers its members an opportunity for mateship, education and skills development in a family friendly environment. 
During his tenure as Board Chair, Mr Horan has guided the organisation through significant periods of expansion, reform and has led a community and patientfocused Health Service.

"Mike has given his all as Board Chair and left no stone unturned when it came to advocating for this organisation - be it for new facilities, additional funding or the introduction of services that would help our communities," Ms Scott said.

"When Darling Downs Hospital and Health Serviced commenced on 1 July 2012, it had approximately 4,900 staff and an operating budget of roughly \$500 million.


Reporter interviewing a 104 year old:
