AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT GRANTS FOR SOUTH BURNETT COMMUNITY GROUPS

Community and service groups in the South Burnett in receipt of funding from the Federal Government's Stronger Communities and Volunteer Grants Programs were presented with certificates by Federal Member for Wide Bay Llew O'Brien recently.

Mr O'Brien met with representatives from the Cherbourg Men's Shed, South Burnett PCYC, Graham House Community Centre, and the Murgon RSL Sub-Branch to congratulate them on receiving funding from the Australian Government.

"The Stronger Communities Program funded a range of projects across Wide Bay that boosted community organisations, delivered social benefits, and strengthened local economies," Mr O'Brien said.

Participants at the Men's Shed in Cherbourg have a new outdoor work space thanks to their \$11,000 grant from the Stronger Communities Program, which made it possible for them to put down a concrete floor and build a steel bench to create an outdoor work space that is fully accessible for participants with a disability. "This has increased the usable space where men can participate in personal and community projects, access health information and resources, and support each other in meaningful activities," Mr O'Brien said.

The South Burnett Police and Community Youth Club have installed a new audio system with their \$10,000 Stronger Communities grant. The club's old system did not meet commercial standards, and the new Yamaha upgrade will service the gym facility used by the local community and by participants in the range of social programs offered by the PCYC. "I am pleased to be able to help the South Burnett PCYC, it's an important place, offering sport, education, and employment and training opportunities for young people, giving them practical real life skills that they can apply to their family and community" Mr O'Brien said.

The Murgon RSL Sub-Branch received \$2,500 from the Stronger Communities Program to set up a website, creating an online one-stop shop where regional veterans and their families can access information on entitlements, welfare and advocacy services, and a calendar of important events.

"The Sub-Branch also received a \$46,115 Veteran Wellbeing Grant to renovate their bathroom, making it accessible for people with a disability or using mobility aids, and \$12,309 from the Building Excellence in Support and Training (BEST) grant program to support veterans and their families with wellbeing advocacy and compensation claims," Mr O'Brien said. The Murgon RSL Sub-Branch was also one of the 27 volunteer organisations in Wide Bay that shared \$66,225 of funding from the 2022-23 Volunteer Grants Program. Their \$1,000 grant provided first aid training for their volunteers, giving them the capacity to respond to medical emergencies.

Volunteers at Graham House Community Centre in Murgon also received training to help them in their community work thanks to their \$2,350 Volunteers Grant. The grant funded training in vicarious trauma, providing Graham House's volunteers with the skills to develop strategies that reduce or prevent secondary trauma when they are assisting clients in the community.

"Vicarious trauma can be an occupational challenge for people working and volunteering with victims of violence and other traumas, and Graham House assists the residents of the South Burnett with family support, emergency relief, counselling, intervention, and behavioural change programs," Mr O'Brien said.

"Every volunteer's contribution, no matter how big or small, is extraordinary because that person cares enough to serve their community and give of their time, expertise, and resources freely to improve the lives of others. Wide Bay communities would not be the same without them," Mr O'Brien said.




Wondai Christmas Eve Carnival Sunday, 24th December 2023

Dedicated Cr Kathy Duff Wins 2023 Shine Award

Twenty years of service as an elected representative & a long-standing record of championing community causes has seen Cr Kathy Duff crowned the winner of the 2023 Shine Awards 'Dedication' category.

Now in their seventh year, the Shine Awards – a collaboration with Harvey Norman and rural newspaper The Weekly Times – seek to recognise the achievements and contributions of women across rural and regional Australia

From a field of over 120 nominees & 19 finalists, Cr Duff emerged with the 'Dedication' award in recognition of her service to the region she has called home her entire life. Between serving as councillor and managing her 6,000-hectare cattle property, Di-Di Station, she has also been a strong advocate for mental health awareness and services in the bush. The former Wondai Shire and current South Burnett councillor said she has been humbled by the award.

"It's an honour to win the 'Dedication' award, especially when you look at the quality of nominees across the country – I was humbled even to be in the discussion."

Winners were celebrated at the IWD Shine Awards dinner in Melbourne on Monday night, and Cr Duff's advocacy for her community 'through tragedy and triumph' was noted by the panel.

Cr Duff's partner Cr Jamie McKenzie passed away from suicide in 2016, losing her father, Mick Duff, shortly

afterwards due to complications with diabetes. Making the best of a bad situation, she donated her subsequent inheritance towards community projects in her hometown of Proston, with \$28,000 donated to establish a Men's Shed & \$60,000 donated to secure the future of the business district shops.

In typical fashion, these selfless contributions came about from her deep love of community. Cr Duff has also spearheaded successful campaigns to secure vital infrastructure & keep services running in several small towns throughout the South Burnett.

"I'm very passionate about the importance of rural communities and making sure they are sustainable and have a voice," Ms Duff said. "We might not have the services & luxuries of the city, but we've got plenty of spirit & character in the South Burnett and it's an honour to fight on behalf of my community."

Cr Duff noted that her award for Dedication reflected the strong work ethic & resolve of her fellow locals.

"I'm always batting for rural communities and rural people."

Changing children's attitudes towards fruit and vegetables



Darling Downs Health staff visiting Meringandan State School

Partnering with Health and Wellbeing Queensland's state-wide initiative Pick of the Crop, Darling Downs Health is planting healthy food habits across schools in the region.

Walking through the gates of Meringandan State School, the first thing you see are garden beds full of fresh produce.

Head of Curriculum at Meringandan State School, Kerry Thompson said the produce is a result of the school getting involved with Pick of the Crop.

"We got involved with Pick of the Crop through Darling Downs Health as we saw an opportunity to be able to engage students with developing the gardens for starters and then start to build interest in nutrition through the fruit and vegetable crop.

"A lot of the students think vegetables just come in packets, so for them to be able to plant vegetables, watch them grow, then pick it straight out of the ground and go 'this is a carrot, this is where it came from' has created lots of excitement.

"Pick of the Crop has been beneficial to our school community, it's not just promoting healthy eating habits, it's helping with wellbeing and mental health," Ms Thompson said.

For Year 1 teacher Shannon Prowse, the vegetable gardens have enabled many learning opportunities.

"I can embed the vegetable gardens in all curriculum areas. For instance, a few weeks ago we made a salad for the principal, he emailed us asking for a recipe, we're currently teaching students procedures in English, so students were able to write down the recipe. Also in maths, we've been looking at the duration of time so how long it takes for a seedling to grow to full maturity," Ms Prowse said.

Pick of the Crop is a whole school initiative to increase fruit and vegetable consumption among Queensland primary school aged children.

Darling Downs Health Assistant Director Nutrition and Dietetics, Danielle Schefe said there's currently seven state primary schools across the region involved with Pick of the Crop, with a further 12 schools currently working on action plans to submit for approval.

"We'd really like to see this number increase. Statistically speaking, fruit and vegetable consumption is quite poor, only 3.1% of Queensland children aged five-11 are eating the recommended amount of five serves of vegetables every day, while 80% eat the recommended two serves of fruit every day.

"Pick of the Crop includes five key components: parent and family connections, vegetables and fruit at school, teaching and learning programs, farmer and food connections and healthy school environments.

"Getting your school involved with Pick of the Crop is simple. We work alongside schools to develop an action plan of how they will integrate the five key components, the plan is then submitted to Health and Wellbeing Queensland. Once the plan is approved, the school can apply for funding which will be received in a lump sum," Ms Schefe said.

Text message support for those experiencing mental health concerns

An innovative new program aimed at providing support for people who self-harm is being trialled in the Darling Downs Health region.

The RAFT (Reconnecting AFTer self-harm) program involves patients receiving supportive text messages alongside existing therapy and care in an effort to reduce suicidal ideation and self-harm.

Darling Downs Health Mental Health and Alcohol and Other Drugs Health Promotion Officer Richard Henshaw said the program was an opportunity to see if non-traditional forms of interventions and support, like text messages, could lead to positive outcomes.

"We are trialling this program in Warwick as part of a national clinical trial," Richard said.

"We hope that people will benefit from receiving regular text messages offering support and links to other self-help resources".


"Over the course of four weeks, most study participants will receive links to online therapeutic content covering topics such as coping with distressing thoughts, emotional regulation, interpersonal relationships, and managing alcohol. Some participants will also have the option to nominate a support person who will receive a one-off text message with helpful information".

Richard said RAFT was developed with input from a lived-experience design group and a clinical design group with expertise in e-mental health, clinical psychology, psychiatry, emergency medicine, drug and alcohol services, and mental health epidemiology.

"The program is a joint initiative between Darling Downs Health and the Black Dog Institute," Richard said.

Chief Investigator for the RAFT trial, A/Prof Mark Larsen from the Black Dog Institute, is hoping to demonstrate through this trial that RAFT can improve outcomes for people discharged from hospital after self-harm. A/Prof Larsen said, "Our aim is that RAFT provides an additional layer of support for people during what is often a difficult and distressing time. We are delighted to continue partnering with Darling Downs Health, who were instrumental to the pilot study of RAFT when it was first developed."





"JP's are the quiet achievers, whose role often goes unnoticed, but we all rely on them for guidance and assistance throughout our life.


"Jeff is also an outstanding volunteer in our community

Summer is here, with all the excitement and activity of the holiday season - and increased traffic on both city and country roads. Unfortunately, *emergencies* – including illness, accident and injury - *do not take holidays* so there are also likely to be even more emergency vehicles on our roads.

By law, drivers must give emergency vehicles a clear, uninterrupted passage through traffic when sirens are sounding and/or emergency lights are flashing. Drivers, if you see/hear an emergency vehicle approaching:

- DON'T PANIC! DON'T stop your vehicle in the middle of the road!
 DON'T create a dangerous situation by moving suddenly or performing illegal manoeuvres.
- DO reduce your speed and merge left (or stay left)
 - if you can't move quickly and safely out of the way, remain calm and wait until it's safe to do so
 - give way to emergency vehicles at intersections controlled by traffic lights, even if light is green.
 - be aware that there may be more than one emergency vehicle.
 - be cautious of other drivers who may panic and act dangerously.

NO TRACE OF H.M.A.S. SYDNEY AFTER SINKING RAIDER

Survivors Located No

CANBERRA, Sunday,-H.M.A.S. Sydney, pride of the Royal Australian Navy, is missing after an engagement with a heavilyarmed enemy merchant raider.

No survivors from the cruiser's complement of 645 officers and ratings have been located.

This news was released to-night by the Prime Minister (Mr. Curtin) after consultation with the Australian Naval Board: "The Government regrets to say that it must be presumed that the Sydney has been lost," said Mr. Curtin. "The Sydney disappeared after a successful action with a raider, which she sank by gunfire."

First news of the action was given by survivors from the enemy vessel who had been picked up. Mr. Curtin gave an assurance that an ex-tensive search was being made by air and surface units for survivors of the Sydney.



A bit about our hosts: 55 Million Years Ago - Museum & Art Gallery

In the late 1980's, fossils found near Boat Mountain just outside Murgon in Southern Queensland rocked the palaeontology world. 15 new fossil species discovered were found to be 55 million years old, predating any other Eocene period fossils found in Australia by

20 million years.

Although tiny in comparison to the bones of dinosaurs and megafauna in western Queensland the Murgon fossils were found to be much older than the Eocene fossils previously found in Riversleigh, fossils that until this date were known to be the oldest fossils recorded in Australia.

Previously unknown creatures? In Murgon? Who knew?

One group that did know, and subsequently made it their mission for the world to know, was the Murgon Creative Country Association, a volunteer based, not for profit organisation that have literally moved mountains to raise the necessary funds to bring the Fossil Experience to life.

Not content with celebrating their Eocene origins, the organisation determined a Fine Art Gallery could act as a launch pad for artists in their community at the same time offering art workshops and activities supporting cultural connection, health, and wellbeing.



"I have been fighting for better regional and rural health care for our community for many years and it is fantastic to see a tele-oncology service working so well to help save the lives of cancer patients.

"No longer do they have to travel hours away for treatment. Instead they are able to stay close to families and friends when they need it the most.

"In the four months since the service began, there have already been 93 individual appointments which means 93 less trips that had to be made to Toowoomba or the coast for treatment.

"There is still much to do however to ensure health services in regional communities like ours are adequate, and I will keep fighting as your voice in the State Parliament," Deb said.
