Martha Waldock, the second youngest daughter of William Marriott & Frances Waldock, married Joseph Angel. Joseph migrated from Germany to Australia with his parents and brother Jacob. The Angel family were attracted to the Kilkivan area by the gold discoveries and then settled there to farm and graze cattle.

As the railway line progressed westwards, Joseph & Martha sent their meat to the settlers along the rail line. They purchased land in and around Murgon in 1906 and in 1907, Martha purchased the Gray's business in **Murgon** which was opposite the railway station. From there they operated a butcher shop and a drapery which was the beginning of Martha Angel's emporium in Murgon which still survives today. Martha ran the businesses while Joseph managed the cattle for the butcher shop.

NEW FUNDING GRANTS TO BOOST LOCAL GOVERNMENTS IN WIDE BAY

Wide Bay councils will receive a funding boost of over \$8 million from the Federal Government, Federal Member for Wide Bay and Minister for Infrastructure and Regional Development Warren Truss said today.

"As of today, the second quarterly payment of \$575 million has begun to be paid to local councils across Australia, under the Federal Government's Financial Assistance Grants programme." Mr Truss said.

Mr Truss said that councils in Wide Bay will receive \$8,181,299 in Financial Assistance Grants each quarter this year, including:

\$138,167 for Cherbourg Aboriginal Shire Council, \$1,856,433 for Fraser Coast Regional Council

\$1,306,618 for Gympie Regional Council, \$530,193 for Noosa Shire Council, \$1,755,925 for South Burnett Regional Council, \$2,573,963 for Sunshine Coast Regional Council

"This funding will be paid in the form of untied grants, meaning that council may spend it according to their own local priorities, whether those priorities are in infrastructure, health, recreation, environment, employment or roads projects," Mr Truss said.

TRUSS WELCOMES \$10,000 BOOST FOR CHERBOURG RECYCLING FACILITY

Federal Member for Wide Bay Warren Truss has today welcomed the announcement of \$10,000 in funding by the Keep Australia Beautiful Association, for the upgrading of Cherbourg Aboriginal Shire Council's recycling facility.

"I congratulate Cherbourg Aboriginal Shire Council on winning this grant for their recycling facility, which will fund an improved waste crushing system for the facility and allow large volumes of recycled materials to be more easily transported for further processing," Mr Truss said.

"I also wish to acknowledge the contribution of Coca Cola Australia, which has made this funding available through the Beverage Container Recycling Grants, administered by the Keep Australia Beautiful Association.

The funding grant comes only weeks after Mr Truss was given a personal tour of the recycling facility, alongside the Federal Minister for Indigenous Affairs, Nigel Scullion.

"It is my hope that this funding will help increase the viability of the recycling facility, which makes a valuable economic contribution to the Cherbourg community," Mr Truss said.

NEW WATER SAFETY INITIATIVE FOR AUSTRALIAN KIDS

Families living in Wide Bay will benefit from a new initiative aimed at increasing water safety in young children, says Federal Member for Wide Bay and Deputy Prime Minister Warren Truss.

"This initiative is focused on increasing water safety awareness in children under the age of five, through the use of songs, videos and books, which are designed to convey the importance of the water safety message in a fun and engaging way," Mr Truss said.

Child care centres, kindergartens, play groups and water safety organisations across Wide Bay will be sent education water safety packs, as part the Federal Government's plan to distribute 80,000 educational packs nationwide.

"The materials in the pack have been developed in conjunction with the well-known water safety campaigner and former Olympic swimming coach Laurie Lawrence, who has previously done valuable work educating children on water safety, through his 'Living with Water' DVD," Mr Truss said.

"It is heartbreaking to read the 2014 National Drowning Report and realize that drowning was responsible for the deaths of 20 children under the age of five, between July 2013 and June 2014.

"I would also encourage people in the community to remain vigilant. especially if you spot children playing near water. Being aware of potential drowning hazards is especially important in these hot summer months. when children may try to access to pools, dams, creeks or livestock troughs to play in. Unfortunately, it may only take a few minutes of a young child being left unattended near water for a tragedy to occur."

The Federal Government has also announced \$4 million in funding for investment in the Royal Life Saving Society of Australia's work to prevent drowning in inland waterways. A further \$15 million has also been provided to fund programmes aimed at reducing the number of drowning deaths nationwide.

"The Federal Government is committed to working with parents and communities to improve water safety awareness and allow children to play in and around water in a safe and enjoyable way." Mr Truss said.

NEW EQUIPMENT SET TO HELP SOUTH BURNETT HOSPITAL STAFF CARE FOR OBESE PATIENTS

South Burnett public hospitals will soon receive special equipment to help staff safely manage markedly overweight patients as part of a \$400,000 program of spending by the Darling Downs Hospital and Health Service (DDHHS).

The local Hospital and Health Board recently approved the purchase of around 100 pieces of bariatric equipment for use across the 20 hospitals operated by the health service.

A patient may be classified as bariatric if they have a body mass index (BMI) greater than 30 and their size or body shape restricts mobility and/or patient care. For men this classification can start at around 144kg and for women about 130kg.

Cherbourg, Kingaroy, Murgon, Nanango and Wondai Hospitals will receive a total of 17 new pieces of bariatric equipment. The items include shower commode chairs, medical wheelchairs, recliner chairs, walkers, and inflatable devices to safely lift large patients to bed or stretcher height, reducing the risk of

Board Chair Mr Mike Horan said the Board decided to spend some of the surplus it had accumulated on improving care to obese patients and ensuring staff were well equipped to care for them.

"Both patient care and staff welfare are priorities in the Board's strategic plan." Mr Horan said.

"Unfortunately we are finding increasing numbers of patients who are dangerously overweight.

"This poses a risk to the patients in hospital to safely use normal equipment like beds, mattresses, shower chairs, commodes and wheelchairs which is designed to be used up to a certain weight but may break beyond this weight."

Mr Horan said staff also caring for these patients needed to be given additional equipment such as specially made hoists, rolling devices and slings to assist them to safely care for patients and not risk injuries to themselves in lifting and turning patients.

Some of the specialist bariatric equipment is rated for patients weighing up to 455kg, with the most common load limits between 250 and 350kg. It will be purchased in 2015.

"Using the surplus generated by the increased productivity of our employees to improve the safety and quality of care provided was a great example of the Board's community divdend program in action," he said.

DDHHS records indicate that last year there were 547 admissions where a patient classified as obese was treated at one of the health service's hospitals.

REGIONAL BLACKSPOT MUST BE A PRIORITY

In a recent assessment undertaken by the Queensland Government to prioritise sites that will then be eligible for funding as part of the Commonwealth Government's \$10M Mobile Blackspot Funding program, WBBROC (Wide Bay Burnett Regional Organisation of Councils) is concerned that a number of the regional priorities for our region will now not be shortlisted.

On behalf of the Member Councils, WBBROC provided a response to the Queensland Government questioning the assessment. Telstra's current Coverage Map has been used by the Queensland Government in its assessment which purports that some of the Wide Bay Burnett regional priorities now have hand-held coverage and are not considered black spot priorities. WBBROC have requested that a further review be completed to determine which areas are jointly recommended as priorities to potentially receive the Mobile Black Spot funding.

Cr Wayne Kratzmann WBBROC Deputy Chair and Mayor, South Burnett Regional Council stated "Council is putting weight behind the push to ensure that the region has full coverage by the main telecommunication network carriers."

Cr Forman, WBBROC Chair and Mayor Bundaberg Regional Council concurred stating "Importantly, given the natural disasters that have occurred in recent years in the region, it is vital that current telecommunication impediments are addressed to provide enhanced standards of communication during times of natural disasters such as fires and flood".

Editors Footnote: It frustrates you when you receive some of these media releases knowing that mobile coverage is not available in so many areas of the South Burnett and you are desperately trying to do business. If the Government's are using Telstra's Coverage Map we believe it needs quickly modifying.




Family and Staff Members joined Cloyna State School Year Sixes at the Murgon Motor Inn to celebrate their Primary School Graduation.





The concept is very simple and open to everyone regardless of their ability, to actually play bowls.




BOOKS THE KEY TO GREAT FUTURE

PROGRESS ON RAIL TRAIL

The Mayor and senior Natural Resource Management staff met with the Deputy Premier to discuss the draft project plan for the Kingaroy to Theebine Rail Trail. "Council has prepared a draft plan with basic project milestones so as to secure the first release of funding. The funding provided by the State Government will enable the development and opening of the rail trail to the public. Once Council have approval to advance the project to the next stage, Council will be engaging the community in a consultation process so as to ensure the best outcome for users of the trail as well as our community" Mayor Wayne Kratzmann said.

Part of the consultation, which will commence in early 2015, will be working through issues and concerns raised with Council. When the funding was first announced, concern over preserving the Queensland tick free zone between Wondai and Kingaroy was raised by landowners. "We understand that ticks are active between Murgon and Kilkivan, therefore there would be no foreseeable issue with horses along this part of the trail. It is currently being proposed that the Murgon to Kingaroy section of the trail will not be open to use by horses" Mayor Wayne Kratzmann explained.

Under the Stock Act 1915 and Stock Notice 2005, livestock must be inspected, cleaned and treated under the supervision of a Biosecurity Queensland Officer (or an approved person) before entering the tick free or control zones. As the section between Murgon and Wondai is in a Queensland control zone and a Queensland tick free zone operates between Wondai and Kingaroy, it is not possible for horses to use the rail trail in these sections at this time.

The rail trail commencing at Murgon and moving through to Kilkivan will link to the Bicentennial National Trail. The Bicentennial National is extends over 5,000 kilometres from Healesville in Victoria to Cooktown in Queensland, being the longest marked route of its kind in the world. The 107-kilometre section through Gympie Regional Council mainly follows the forest ridges to the west of the highly populated plains of the Cooloola region. The rail trail will also provide a link to the annual Kilkivan Great Horse Ride event which offers a variety of trails, over various distances.

TRIPLE P HITS PARENTS WITH POWER TO MAKE CHILDREN HAPPY



Positive Parenting Program (Triple P) graduates learned new ways to discipline their children after doing a three-day workshop (November 17-19).

The group was shown how to make children compliant with their wishes without the use of physical force.

Former participants' partners who took part said they now understood the methods their partners had tried to instil within their home.

Facilitator Bronwyn Murray will now give after-workshop support for those that want it, when she can.

"As adults we don't know our own strength," she said explaining the Triple P principal against smacking.

"Hitting children instils fear and as they get older they can become bitter, hard and resentful. They rebel.

"Triple P, I believe, teaches better strategies to discipline children without physical force."

Bronwyn said you could see improved behaviour within children of parents or carers who did Triple P and then used its strategies on a consistent basis.

"I say to people who do it, even if you just try one thing like time out, you will see a difference," Bronwyn said. "We have parents say 'yeah, I tried that and it worked."


I REMEMBER WHEN by Margaret Greer

Martha was nicknamed "The Mother of Murgon". She was known for her generosity to people in hard times and for her support of the town's many public bodies.

The Angel family including sons and daughters and grand children has continued this tradition for over 100 years with Spencer Angel (deceased) serving on the local council. The business has gone through several manifestations, from one end of the building to the other it consisted of a Motor Garage, Leach's accountants, Joe Battles Café, Angels Butcher Shop, Angels Drapery and Angels Grocery 4 Square shop.

The Motor Garage was run by Billy Angel and the Butcher shop by Spencer Angel and son Peter. Bill Angel senior, a respected Murgon businessperson and his wife I believe oversaw the Angel dynasty during the sixties.

A fitting remembrance to Keith Goodchild is the park entering Murgon from Goomeri known as the Keith Goodchild Rotary Park, Keith was a former president of both Murgon Apex and Murgon Rotary and was a dedicated member of the Murgon Rifle Club. Keith served in the AIF in the New Guinea region during World War Two. Keith Goodchild formerly of Murgon passed away on the 28th April 2014 in Canberra where he resided with wife Cleo (nee Angel) for the last 15 years. Keith is survived by wife Cleo and daughter Angela.


