The 100th birthday of retired Murgon businessman – and World War II veteran – Alfred "Mick" Purser was celebrated at a morning tea at Southern Cross Care (Castra) in Murgon..

Friends, other residents and Castra staff joined with Mick's wife Heather, 96, and son Russell, from Noosa, to celebrate the big day in Castra's recreation room.

There was cake, candles and even a morning of music!

It was the second birthday celebration for Mick ... on Saturday, he enjoyed a family get-together with about 70 people at the Murgon RSL Sub-Branch's Drop-In Centre, organised by his daughter Lynne, from Brisbane.

But Castra, where Mick and Heather now reside, couldn't let Mick's actual birthday pass without a party.

Mick grew up on the family's dairy farm, 'Bendee', between Murgon and Nanango (now part of the Bjelke-Petersen Dam).

He enlisted in the RAAF on August 25, 1941.

Russell told southburnett.com.au his father initially served in the Charters Towers and Townsville areas recovering and repairing parts from downed US aircraft.

He then was sent to Adelaide where he trained as a pilot, and began flying DC-3s from Australia to Papua New Guinea.

After he was discharged in 1946, Mick returned to Murgon to complete his apprenticeship as a mechanic with Vic Tessmann.

Mick later bought the business, located where Murgon IGA is now, and called it Murgon Garage.

In 1967, he purchased a school bus run and began building up a bus and coach business. He sold the Murgon Garage to concentrate on his new venture.

In 1996, Mick sold Purser's Coaches to Harvy Dascombe who has continued, along with son Andrew, to build the business into a fleet which now consists of 50 vehicles.

Harvy picked up Mick on Saturday in one of Purser's buses to take him to his birthday celebration ... "He wouldn't let me drive!" Mick said.

Guest speakers at the Castra celebration included Murgon Business and Development Association president Leo Geraghty (a later owner of the Murgon Garage, by then Mitsubishi Murgon) and Trevor Otto, father of South Burnett mayor Brett Otto, who formerly worked for Mick.

Mick and Heather have been married for an amazing 76 years.

"Heather was Presbyterian and I was Church of England so we were married in the Methodist Church in Murgon," Mick joked.

The couple has two children, Russell and Lynne; four grandchildren, 10 great-grandchildren and two great-greatgrandchildren.

Mick and Heather have volunteered in multiple community groups in the Murgon region for decades, including the Girl Guides, Scouts and Murgon Hospital.

Deb represents concerns of region on impact of bank closures

Shadow Member for Regional Development and Member for Nanango, Deb Frecklington has made a submission to the Federal Senate Committee currently investigating the impact of bank closures in regional Australia.

Deb said it was an important opportunity to share information with the Federal Committee about the many bank closures that have occurred across the Nanango Electorate.

"Over the past several years, there have been continual bank closures in towns across the Nanango Electorate including Suncorp Kingaroy, NAB Esk and Murgon, ANZ Toogoolawah, Kilcoy and Kingaroy and reduced hours at Commonwealth Murgon," Deb said.

"On behalf of my community, I wanted to share the economic and welfare impacts of bank closures on people from our region.

"Unfortunately, the closure of regional branches is a common theme for the big banks, who believe they can service their customers just as well online.


"We know that many people in regional areas have slow internet connection, or no computer access at all, so internet banking isn't always the answer. Residents of regional townships value their local bank branches.

"A complete lack of public transport across the Nanango Electorate also means it is not always possible for them to travel to another township to access a branch.

"Another important issue we're seeing in regional Queensland is the issue of cybercrime. More and more people are being targeted in scams and there is a genuine need for victims of these crimes to be able to access their bank in person to discuss and rectify their situation. Often these victims are older Australians, who can struggle to deal with the banks via the phone or internet.

"The loss of any service is always devastating for small townships, who too often feel the brunt of large companies relinquishing their commitment to serve regional areas



Water Meter Replacement Program - Kingaroy and Wondai

South Burnett Regional Council advises as part of Council's routine maintenance programs and commitment to ensure the long-term sustainability and efficiency of Council's water infrastructure, Council has commenced a water meter replacement program in Kingaroy and Wondai.

The replacement program will commence on Monday 17 April 2023 and is expected to be completed by 30 June 2023, weather permitting.

Water meters are mechanical devices that wear with usage and age. Council has a proactive replacement program for water meters which are nearing the end of their useful life. It's an ongoing program that ensures your water meter readings (and your bills) remain as accurate as possible.

Water meter replacement depends on the specifications of the individual meter. It is normal that your meter may in fact be replaced but the meter belonging to your neighbour may not be.

Council apologises for any inconvenience that this work may cause and thank you in advance for your patience

The following steps may assist following water maintenance works:


- Flush your plumbing by running inside and outside taps
- Avoid using the washing machine or dishwasher should water be discoloured.

Frequently asked questions:

- What causes discolouration in water? Water mains maintenance, repairs or flushing may result in sediment being disturbed in the water pipes, resulting in the tap water appearing discoloured. In some instances, organic material found in the main water source may also cause discolouration.
- Who pays for the water lost whilst water mains are repaired or replaced? The cost is covered by Council's maintenance budget.

Can the water lost during water mains repairs or maintenance be recycled? No, Council does not recycle the water for public health reasons.

Council Commences 2023 Planned Burn Season

South Burnett Regional Council's annual planned burn season is underway for 2023 with 4 key sites prioritised across the region.

South Burnett Regional Councillor Scott Henschen said, "The first hazard reduction burn of the season will be carried out at Boondooma Reserve from the 26, 27 and 28 of April. Other priority sites include Staines Road Reserve, Wondai East and Showgrounds and Wondai West will undergo burns before September, if conditions are suitable."

"Planned burns are an essential practice for us to help reduce fuel loads, such as grasses and dense undergrowth, and mitigate the risk of bushfires in our reserves while enhancing biodiversity," Cr Henschen said.

Council collaborates with the Queensland Fire and Emergency Services (QFES) and local Rural Fire Brigades (RFB) to execute each burn. RFB conduct each burn in accordance with a QFES Prescribed Burn Plan, which outlines the ideal temperature, fuel moisture, wind speed and direction, and humidity level to conduct the burn.

Each year the burn 'window of opportunity' is typically during the cooler months between April and September, and we're pleased to be on schedule this year after the wet weather delayed last year's season.

Before each burn RFB undertake a meticulous analysis of conditions including identifying ideal temperatures, fuel moisture, wind speed and direction, and humidity levels to conduct the burn under 'cool burn' conditions.

"Council considers impacts to flora, fauna, and our surrounding communities, and use a range of techniques to conduct safe planned burns to maintain and improve biodiversity and ecological values for the natural environment. We're always extremely mindful of the effects that smoke from planned burns may have on neighbours and visitors and appreciate their understanding while we work with the relevant agencies on this safety initiative," said Cr Henschen.





Youth Mental Health First Aid for Parents & Carers

The Youth Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) Course teaches adults (18 years and over) how to provide initial support to adolescents who are developing a mental illness or experiencing a mental health crisis.

Date & Time: The course will run over 3 sessions on a Thursday from 5pm to 8pm on the

following dates: 11th May, 18th May, 25th May.

Participants need to attend all three sessions to receive a Mental Health First Aid certificate.

Venue: Barambah Youth Services Hub (up from the Murgon State High School

administration centre) Gore Street, Murgon

Facilitator: Anita Smith (Rural Ed LinQ Coordinator - Senior Psychologist)

Cost: FREE. All participants will receive a YMHFA manual and certificate.

Course Content

Mental illnesses often start in adolescent or early adulthood, and it is important to detect problems early to ensure the young person is properly treated and supported. The YMHFA course teaches adults who have frequent contact with adolescents such as parents, guardians, school staff, sport coaches and youth workers, how to assist adolescents who are developing a mental health problem or are in a mental health crisis. The YMHFA course teaches adults how to assist adolescents who are developing any of the following mental health problems or mental health crises:

Developing mental health problems:

- * Depression
- * Anxiety
- * Eating disorders
- * Psychosis
- * Substance use problems

Mental Health Crises:

- * Suicidal thoughts and behaviours
- * Non-suicidal self-injury
- * Panic attacks
- * Traumatic events
- * Severe Psychotic states
- * Severe effects from alcohol/other drug use
- * Aggressive behaviours
- * Medical emergencies with eating disorders

Participants will learn about adolescent development and the signs and symptoms of mental health problems, how and where to get help and what sort of help has been shown by research to be effective.
