VIETNAM VETERANS ENCOURAGED TO APPLY FOR COMMEMORATIVE MEDALLION

Federal Member for Wide Bay Llew O'Brien is encouraging Vietnam veterans to apply for the Commemorative Medallion and Certificate of Commemoration that acknowledges the 50th anniversary of the end of Australia's involvement in the Vietnam War.

"Between 1962 and 1975, almost 60,000 Australians served during the Vietnam War and while Australia can never repay the debt we owe these veterans, the medallion and certificate are a small way to honour their service," Mr O'Brien said.

"More than 500 Australians lost their lives in the Vietnam War, and we remember their sacrifice and honour the veterans who returned home bearing the physical and mental scars of their service."

All Australian veterans who served in the Vietnam War are eligible to receive a medallion, and the widow or family member of an Australian veteran who served is also eligible to apply.

Only one medallion is available for each Vietnam War veteran. It is recommended that an agreement is made within the family of a deceased veteran as to who will apply for the medallion and certificate, as the registration process prevents multiple applications on behalf of the same veteran.

Darling Downs Health's aged care facilities

Darling Downs Health has completed \$2.6 million worth of infrastructure upgrades at four aged care facilities across the health service.

Executive Director Infrastructure Dr Paul Clayton said Inglewood, Millmerran and Texas aged care residents are now able to enjoy a new outdoor area, with Oakey's outdoor area upgrade to be completed in the coming weeks.

"The areas are designed to help residents and their families have additional spaces to spend time together.

"Each new area will feature a gazebo, BBQ area, new walkways, fencing and gardens.

"We've designed these spaces to make the facilities more accessible and engaging for residents and their quests.

"We have so many great facilities across our Health Service and to be able to continue to improve them and create additional functional areas is really important," Dr Clayton said.

Executive Director Rural Health Dr Chris Cowling said it's great to see an investment in outdoor infrastructure at some of Darling Downs Health's aged care facilities.

"These works will improve accessibility and the experience for resident and visitors.

"The gardens are enclosed, meaning residents will be able to walk safely outdoors around the facilities.

"We realise the significance of encouraging residents to stay as mobile for as long as possible, a lack of mobility can lead to ongoing challenges with their care.

"We know how beneficial these upgrades will be for our aged care residents and I'm pleased to see this investment in our rural facilities, Dr Cowling said.

Yarraman Heritage Museum

The Heritage house was originally built as a convent in anticipation of Australia being invaded in World War II, but the war ended by the time The Sacred Heart Convent was completed in 1945.

The Sisters of Mercy took over the convent and opened it as a school comprising a boarding school for boys in 1946 and continued through to 1966. One of the original boarding bed and mattress is displayed in the museum.

Over the years afterwards, it also operated as a Nun's retreat, a safe house for women and children, before being handed over to the Aboriginal sector of the Roman Catholic Church in the late 1980s. Aboriginal people used it as a halfway house for a few years. The museum provides a snapshot of life in the early 1900s. The Museum comprises eight historic buildings experience a guided tour of the Heritage House complex, craft shop, Museum, Community Radio, and the historian about pioneer families. Visitors will also find the Yarraman Railway Station, Arthur Brown's Butcher Shop, a typical slab hut circa 1921, and a farmer's cottage circa 1930. Take in the Military Memorabilia and marvel at the rail display.

With my sisters we went to school here, Leo is on the left, my father was the station master for 12 months before the man in the middle, I can remember as a boy going for a ride in the train engine from the station to the timber mill.

Yarraman is the start of the Brisbane Valley Rail Trail through to Ipswich, the first section is 18km through to Blackbutt. The start of the trail is at Station Park, which is found by continuing further along Millar St.

Great Museum Well worth a visit.





Barambah Garden Club.



Members and guests of the Garden Club held their September gathering at the home of Barbara Hartmann King in Nagel Ct. Murgon. There was a wonderful roll-up of nineteen members and guests.

Morning tea was served and much interest centred around the competition table with its colourful display of flowers, also natives, herbs and fruit. Everybody voted for their favourite in the many divisions.

Winners of the various sections was announced and the vice president Lyn Norton introduced the guest speaker for the day, Warren Rose, also of Nagel Ct. Warren and his wife Shelley manufacture the product 'Worm Farm Oasis'.

Worm Farm Oasis is a bio-fertilizer made from worm castings and actively aerated rainwater. This fertilizer, referred to as 'worm compost tea' can be applied directly to soil or sprayed onto plant foliage.

Warren made it clear that this is not the liquid you get from the bottom of your worm bin that has derived from decomposing food waste. This may contain unknown pathogens, bacteria and other microbes causing harm to your plants and to your health if you eat those plants.

Warren listed the many benefits of his compost tea. It improves soil structure, adds nutrients so plants can uptake minerals and resist disease and have more immunity against pests. The list was huge and very interesting. Some members were interested in buying the worm compost tea and trying it on their gardens. All were convinced that growing organically is so necessary for our health and wellbeing.

"I became a Credentialed Diabetes Educator in 2020, moved to Kingarov, and began engaging with community clients from all walks of life," Ms Densley said.


"I am honoured that people in my community felt that I held the values and knowledge to be nominated for the CDE of the Year for Queensland."



Murgon Men's Shed Railway Museum





Our father, Tom Geraghty, retired from the railway as Assistant Station Master at South Brisbane when they were handling both the Queensland and New South Wales trains.

As a young lad, I was fortunate enough to once ride in a similar engine when it went all the way to Proston. Leo knew more about trains than motor cars when he started employment at Clifton Motors.

Dennis is Leo's brother and we lived in the railway house opposite the post office.

Our father was the station master and would have ridden in that locomotive whilst shunting the many different types

of railway wagons etc with other railway employees in the many different railway stations.

He worked in Maryborough, Goomeri, Monkland, Dalby, Gatton, Babinda, Chillagoe, Tingoora, Yarraman, Proston, Murgon and lastly South Brisbane.



The long journey by the Murgon Men's Shed to secure a steam locomotive to park beside the South Burnett Rail Trail was finally realised on Monday with the unveiling of C17 No 763.

Member for Wide Bay Llew O'Brien cut the ribbon to officially open the railway display, which also includes two partially restored carriages.

The 37 tonne C17 steam locomotive and 17 tonne tender were transported from an Australian Railway Historical Society storage area at Rosewood in early August.

They were in very poor condition upon their arrival, so the Men's Shed members set about tidying them up and killing the rust.

The paint only went on this week, leaving the locomotive looking in mint condition on Monday although, sadly, it will never haul any more goods or people on Queensland rail lines.

The engine was built in 1927 by Walkers in Maryborough, a company which is still building trains!

This particular locomotive served in the Toowoomba and Ipswich areas, but C17s were the models which used to plough along South Burnett lines.

No 763 was retired from service in 1969 and placed in a park in Paddington, Brisbane, where it was a target for vandals before being shifted to Rosewood for safe keeping.

Murgon Men's Shed president David Mollenhauer said the display would not have been possible without a \$25,000 donation by Murgon resident, and Men's Shed member, Col Pearen, which enabled the hire of the cranes and trucks necessary to bring the locomotive and tender to Murgon.


The locomotive has been placed under a specially designed shelter in front of a wooden 1918 passenger car and steel goods wagon which the group are working on restoring, creating an eye-catching static display beside the former railway tracks.

The project received two grants from the Federal Government to help it become a reality: \$15,000 from Round 6 of the Stronger Communities Program and \$33,000 from Round 5 of the Building Better Regions Fund for the steel shed and annex.

"The Rail Display Complex is an exciting initiative at the start of the South Burnett Rail Trail that provides a fascinating glimpse into the history of Queensland railways and will boost tourism through the South Burnett," Mr O'Brien said.

Mr Mollenhauer said that whenever the Murgon Men's Shed was open, the gates to the display area would also be open so that anyone on the adjacent South Burnett Rail Trail could come in and take a look.

Successful Funding for Capital Works at Wondai Waste Facility

South Burnett Regional Council is pleased to advise that the grant application made under Round Three (3) of the 2022-2024 Local Government Levy Ready Grant Program to carry out capital works at the Council owned Wondai Waste Facility in Wondai Queensland has been successful.

To assist local governments to meet the obligations of the Waste Reduction and Recycling Act 2011 (the Act), the Local Government Levy Ready Grant Program offers funding to undertake necessary infrastructure upgrades.

Round Three (2022-24) of the grant program was targeted to support eligible local governments within the levy zone to transition sites that were not eligible for funding through previous rounds.

The project works for which Council was successful in achieving funding under Round Three (3) of this grant program entails installing a weighbridge with waste measurement software, upgrade of transfer station, operator's cabin and traffic management infrastructure including civil and road works associated with the reconfiguration at the Council owned Wondai Waste Facility in Wondai.

Under Round Three (3) of this grant program funding, Council will receive a subsidy of 62.5% or up to \$368,973.75 towards eligible project costs with the remaining cost of \$221,384.25 (or 37.5%) for the project to be borne by Council. The total project cost is estimated to be \$590,358.

The project works will commence in November 2023 and is expected to be completed by 30 June 2024.

Council is extremely grateful to have received the subsidy of 62.5% or up to \$368,973.75 towards eligible project costs for the project from the State of Queensland through the Department of Environment and Science (DES).

The Department of State Development, Local Government, Infrastructure and Planning (DSDILGP) is administering the Program on behalf of the Department of Environment and Science (DES).



Support the Petition for upgrades to Kingaroy-Barkers Creek Road

I am pleased to back a petition from local Wattle Camp residents, Chas and Carol Kemp (pictured), to upgrade the three single-lane sections of Kingaroy-Barkers Creek Road to two lanes. Chas and Carol have been highlighting their concerns with me about this road for several years and have shared stories about near misses and damage to their car's tyres and windscreen.

Kingaroy-Barkers Creek Road is a busy key connection road between Kingaroy and the Burnett Highway, and it is obvious the single-lane sections need to



be widened to a two-lane standard. The road is in a very poor condition, with rough, steep edges and it is unsafe for the increasing number of vehicles using this route.

In 2021, I asked the Minister for Transport and Main Roads when funding would be allocated to Kingaroy-Barkers Creek Road but the request fell on deaf ears. But this time we're hoping a petition will shine a spotlight on the community's concerns about Kingaroy-Barkers Creek Road and how unsafe it has become.

GRAND OPENING OF 55 MILLION YEARS AGO FOSSIL MUSEUM AND FINE ART GALLERY

This is a "Chance Building!"



It was by **chance** that local Murgon resident Glenda Geraghty attended a fossil dig with paleontologist Henk Godthelp and his team in the pit at Boat Mountain outside of Murgon. With the help of reputable scientists from the University of Sydney it was determined that the fossils found here, dating back 55 million years ago, were 20 million years older than any previously recorded.

Once this was understood Glenda believed these fossils could be used for education and tourism and her pursuit of this outcome took hold.

A conversation was struck up with Richard O'Neill O.A.M. who was receptive to the idea of a museum being established in Murgon.

He later had a **chance** meeting with Lee Porter (international artist) in the IGA grocery store who wanted to start an art gallery. So, they decided to organize a meeting with another artist, Carolyn Summers in June 2018, and as a result Creative Country Association Inc was formed with two artists, two fossil enthusiasts and no money.

A range of different options for a building were investigated including old railway carriages and the more their ideas grew, so did the vision for their project. So, they decided to start a bank account with their own money to obtain an ABN and start searching for grants.

As word spread about the idea of a fossil museum in Murgon the Committee received two large private donations, including land, and community donations and garage sales began.

They even ran a silent movie that was shot in Murgon at Barambah Station to raise funds.

Again, **the chance** of what we envisaged happening was very remote, However, it was a \$1.526 million dollar Australian Federal Government Grant that finally allowed the building to begin and the Committee's dream

to became a reality.

Sellwood Constructions was commissioned as the builder and **by chance** Sellwood Constructions believed in the project and went above the call of duty. **By chance** a committee member knew of Tourism Tap who were employed as the marketing consultant and this is another supporter who went above the call of duty.

By chance Professor Michael Archer AM, FAA distFRSN, FRZS, FACE and his team who also took part in digging for fossils here at Boat Mountain outside of Murgon were also passionate supporters committed to ensuring the fossil museum would be scientifically correct.

By chance Tourism Tap introduced Earth Story (renowned production company) who with Professor Mike Archer (renowned paleontologist) and Peter Schouten AM FRSN (artist for museum diorama) spent many months liaising with other scientists to unearth the fascinating fossil finds, facts and features that would eventually be shared with the world in the museum.

This purpose built museum has an art gallery, fossilarium, fossil museum, art workshop, gift shop, and a central prehistoric garden.

Even with these professionals on board it was a hard task for such a small Committee and when family commitments required some of them to reduce their input Leo Geraghty O.A.M. took on the position of Secretary and his enthusiasm helped lift flagging spirits to get the project over the finish line.

As MC for the opening Leo Geraghty OAM described the interior of this massive green building without windows and that has 3 exit points.

On your left of the front counter is a fossilarium owned by Scott & Kimberley Smith. These fossils on sale are from all over the world. On your right is a gift shop and information area, Prehistoric Garden where you can see the numbered plants that were around in the era of 55 million years ago.

You can walk around the garden but please do not enter the garden as there is some very small plants there. The toilets are also on your right. These areas I have mentioned are all free entry areas and can be used by people using the rail trail. The only areas you are required to pay on entry is to the 55mya fossil museum and art gallery.

Mc Leo explained why some of these invited guests were apologies.

Special mention was made to a lady who has gone well above her experience and knowledge but has continually applied for grants, been knocked back by most but has enjoyed those that have helped build this building. Thank you Glenda and for putting up with mee these last few months.

Leo then said You know when things are really tough and you are pulling your hair out trying to do the lot, three lovely ladies came to our rescue, Robyn Dower, Marie Routledge and Dianne Woodall who organized all the art gallery and hung all the paintings and art work, many many thanks to you ladies.

Then along comes a guy called Michael who works with me who we have nicknamed NO TROUBLE because that is the answer we get when we ask him for help, he's a lovely guy.

And then the icing on the cake, along comes Peter Coombs and his wife Jenny who have signed on as volunteers. Peter has handled all the training of the use of the machines and tecknical items with the volunteers, thank you Peter and Jenny you have been a blessing.

We hope you enjoy what we have built and accompany us in following our dream and look out for those people who come to your place, knock on the door and ask, mind if we dig up your back yard.

Now let me introduce you to Graham Potter chair of Riversley museum

Mc Leo thanked Graham for coming and for his presentation


Being recognised for this award is not only an honour for both of us, but also an achievement for The South Burnett region.
