Since the first sod was turned in February 2021 there has been a great deal of speculation about the work being carried out at 73Macalister St in Murgon. What was being built? What was it for? What was inside? Will it ever be finished?

South Burnett Regional Council Supports LifeFlight and their lifesaving Service

South Burnett Regional Council commenced the Community Rescue and Evacuation separate charge on 1 July 2010 and from this date up until 30 June 2023 South Burnett ratepayers, through this initiative, have generously donated \$736,614.26 to LifeFlight and the lifesaving service they provide to the South Burnett Region.

LifeFlight provide a vital service and many residents can be thankful for the swift transfer to a major hospital in the case of an emergency. The Community Rescue and Evacuation special charge was introduced in 2010 to assist these services that rely heavily on donations to continue operation. Since the introduction of the charge, RACQ LifeFlight Rescue has provided assistance to the South Burnett with an excess of 2,349 flights to those in need, with a cost of approximately \$25,000 per flight. These flights come at no cost to the patients.

The Community Rescue and Evacuation separate charge is currently a \$5 levy on all rate assessments. In Council's opinion, it is more appropriate to raise funds by a separate charge rather than from general funds to ensure the community is aware of the Council's commitment to ensure ongoing support for the vital community service. It also considers the benefit is shared equally by all rateable parcels of land regardless of their value.

Recognition of Roy Emerson, Tennis Icon

South Burnett Regional Council is pleased to announce that a small section of Hart Street in Blackbutt has been named "Roy Emerson Way" in honour of Roy Emerson's significant connection to the Blackbutt and South Burnett region. The section extends from the D'Aguilar Highway to the "Roy Emerson Museum" on Hart Street and signage was installed on Wednesday 9 August 2023.

"South Burnett Regional Council would like to recognise and congratulate this milestone to Roy Emerson and his family. Roy Emerson is one of Australia's greatest sporting icons and a local to our region, having been "born and bred" on farmland on the D'Aguilar Highway near the section identified" said Acting Mayor Gavin Jones.

Roy Emerson AC received one of Australia's highest honours being made a companion of the Order of Australia medal (AC) on Australia Day in 2019 "for eminent service to tennis as a player at the national and international level, to the promotion of the sport and as an information to young sportspersons".

Roy went on to be one of the greatest tennis players of all time, winning the Australian Open, the US Open, The French Open and Wimbledon. His record of 12 individual grand slams stood for over 30 years before being passed by Pete Sampras and ultimately, Roger Federer.





Faculty of Medicine

UQ medical students immersed in Darling Downs and South West communities.

Over fifty Year 1 medical students from The University of Queensland (UQ) embarked on a four day "immersion" tour to experience the charms and challenges of rural and remote living.

St George, Roma, Kingaroy, Stanthorpe and Goondiwindi welcomed a group of students each, to visit local industries, schools, medical centres and hospitals to gain an understanding of the regions medical capacity. The students also participated in community activities to experience the local spirit and connect with people through a homestay experience.

The inaugural Immersion Program is part of the new Doctor of Medicine curriculum, which gives 100 Year 1 students an opportunity to learn outside of the classroom and integrate into one of eight rural and remote communities in the Central Queensland, Wide Bay, Darling Downs and South West regions.

Mayne Academy of Rural and Remote Medicine Head, Professor Bruce Chater OAM said the Year 1 immersion was an exciting and, possibly, lifechanging experience.

"This experience is about making rural medical careers visible to our students and creating engaging opportunities that spark feelings of belonging.

"We hope that the students saw the charms and challenges for our communities and consider staying to practice rural and remote medicine in their future.

"The communities have been incredibly supportive; not only in helping arrange some fantastic tours and activities, but also in opening their homes for students to partake in homestays," Professor Chater said.

Rural Clinical School Acting Director Dr Doogie Whitcombe said this was a wonderful opportunity for students to start building relationships.

"It's a chance to get to know the regions medical professionals, teachers, hospitality workers, homestay families and community volunteers to name a few.

"It's hoped that the experience leads our students to pursue future career opportunities in the region," Dr Whitcombe said.

Research shows that early introduction to rural medicine and repeat exposure to rural placements positively influences a student's intention to enter the rural workforce.

Managing weaners: three must-do's for muster

Key points:

- Coming into muster, producers should consider these three things when managing weaners: low stress handling, critical nutrition and pain mitigation
- · Low stress handling is better for the livestock and staff
- · Nutrition is critical to get weaners off to a good start
- Animal husbandry practices such as castration and dehorning have a known impact on productivity of weaners. This impact can be minimised by the right approach to handling and managing animals at muster, including a focus on good nutrition, minimising stress and administering pain relief treatments.
- Station hand at 'Napier Downs' in the east Kimberley and winner of the leadership award at last year's Livestock Handling Cup, Charlie Howarth is a big advocate for low stress livestock handling.
- "Not only is it better for your cattle, but it's also much easier to work in the yards. The livestock are less likely to run through gates or get injured," Charlie said.
- Charlie describes a low stress environment not only as one where there is good handling of livestock, but where animal behaviours are front of mind and animal wellbeing is a focus. This includes access to water and feed, vaccinations and the use of pain mitigation for husbandry procedures.
- Brooke Harwood is the Manager Assistant at CPC's 'Carlton Hill' station in the east Kimberley and is also an advocate for low stress livestock handling.
- "By implementing low stress livestock handling methods, we work with the animals, not against them. This decreases the level of stress on the animals and helps increase the animals' productivity," Brooke said.
- "Another main factor of using low stress stock handling is it prevents staff injuries whilst working in the confined areas of the yards and decreases the level of dust produced that hinders visibility."
- Désirée Jackson is a nutritionist and a deliverer of the Nutrition EDGE and Breeding EDGE programs. She has worked with many producers across northern Australia to develop their weaner nutrition management programs, both in the paddock and at weaning.
- "Managing animals well in the yards helps to ensure they quickly adjust to a grass-based diet once they are turned-off on to pasture, enabling them to be productive sooner," Désirée said.
- "Mob segregation into weight groups is important to give all weaners the best chance to get the nutrition they need, and allows for targeted feeding suited to the requirements of each weight group, if this is practical.
- "This is particularly important for lighter weaners, as they are still developing physiologically, and failure to provide adequate nutrients can compromise their development and subsequent performance.
- "This can be used to reduce bullying of smaller, younger weaners off feed and to ensure evenness of intake of supplements.
- "Good quality hay that is palatable and digestible is critical in weaners transitioning from a milk-based diet onto pasture, especially younger animals whose rumen function may not be as well developed."



A LONG RAIL JOURNEY ENDS

In 2014 Murgon Men's Shed founding President, Paul Pfiefer, purchased two rail carriages in Rockhampton. However, with delays due to a flood in Rocky and transport problems, Paul passed away before seeing the carriages set up in Murgon. Eventually, the carriages arrived in Murgon and a grant from Stanwell Power enabled restorative work to start on the carriages.

It was decided an engine in front of the carriages would make a better display and create more interest. Some 5 years ago, we decided to make inquiries to get a steam engine. A D17 had been given to Murgon Council in 1974 and sat near the tennis courts. Then in later years it ended up at Rosewood Rail Museum. This D17 was on offer. It was a heavier suburban engine and had never been on our line.

A C17 and D17 had both been placed down the track at Rosewood with a line of carriages behind from the museum, on a deterring line in a low area, the Museum called Frog's Hollow. Meanwhile, we wanted to build a shed to house our carriages and it would be situated near the front of the Rail Station here at Murgon. But Department of Transport wanted the rail corridor clear. So we had to move the carriages. Tracks were laid to the side of the Station, the carriages were moved and we started planning for a rail shed, which was finished before Christmas 2022.



Numerous trips to Rosewood were made to negotiate getting the engine. These trips were spent cleaning and cutting and spraying vines and small trees that covered the engines and everything. Finally, we were on our way to getting an engine. For years, this low area was extremely wet. Large amounts of sleepers and bridge material had to be moved before trucks and a crane could get anywhere near the engines.



This year's dry summer provided us the first opportunity to get an engine without getting everything bogged. The Museum cleaned the sleepers and other rail rubbish, clearing the way to get trucks and crane close to the engines. The D17 ended up being to difficult to get, so the C17 was offered to us which suited us better, as the C17 is part of our rail history.

On August 2nd, two low loader trucks and 100 ton crane along with support trucks descended on the Museum, loading the engine first, then the tender onto the second truck without incident. The two trucks arrived back in Murgon by 4.30pm. The two trucks were unloaded at Murgon Men's Shed on Friday 4th August. Using a 100 ton crane from Kingaroy.

The C17 was part of Murgon's rail history. Our C17, No. 763, was built in 1927 by Walkers Ltd, Maryborough. There were 227 C17 engines built from 1920 to 1953, all of which were replaced by diesel engines in 1969. 202 have been scrapped, and 25 have been preserved.

Our C17 engine is 16.29 metres long, weighs 56 ton dry, 82 ton full (with coal and water). Boiler pressure is 7.206KPA, has 2 cylinders, 17inch x 22inch stroke. There is a lot of work to restore the



engine to a good static display to go along with our other rail memorabilia.



The train engine and coal tender will be painfully restored to its original glory during the following months. If anyone has any Railway items they wish to donate or have on display, please contact the Murgon Men's Shed. Congratulations to all involved and we look forward to seeing the finished product. Men's Shed president Dave Mollenhauer said a generous donation of \$25,000 to the Murgon Men's Shed by one of its members, Col Pearen, had helped to cover the cost of crane hire at Rosewood (\$12,000) and Murgon (\$9000) as well as the \$5000 for the two semi-trailers. The locomotive and tender will form a static display under cover near the two restored railway carriages. You are cordially invited to The Murgon Men's Shed Railway Museum which will be officially opened

Monday 2nd October at 10 am by Mr Llew O'Brien MP before the opening of 55 million years ago next door.

Stay safe during magpie swooping season

South Burnett Regional Council urges residents to stay alert and watch out for swooping magpies this season to keep yourself safe. Almost all magpie swoops occur between July and November each year when the male magpies are defending their eggs and chicks.

The Department of Environment and Science (DES) recommends the following to minimise the risk of a magpie attack taking place:

• Wear a broad-brimmed hat and sunglasses or shelter under an umbrella to protect your face from swooping magpies (painting or sticking large 'eyes' on the back of your hat can also deter magpies—but this won't work for cyclists)

• If a magpie swoops while you are cycling, it will likely stop if you get off your bike and walk

• Avoid defence zones by taking alternative routes during the breeding season. A defence zone is usually within 110m for pedestrians and 150m for cyclists from the

nest.

• If you must enter a 'defence zone', magpies will be less likely to swoop if they are watched constantly, or if people walk in a close group

• Use signs to warn others of the location of nests and defence zones, particularly in areas used by children and the elderly

• Waving sticks or umbrellas in the air or attaching a brightly coloured flag on a long pole to your bicycle can stop magpies from swooping

• It is not recommended to fight back if a magpie swoops, including throwing sticks or rocks, as this can make the magpie more aggressive next time anyone enters the defence zone

Only a small proportion of magpies swoop and often have preferred targets, like pedestrians and cyclists. A magpie's defensive behaviour includes non-contact swooping with or without beak snapping, pecking, dive-bombing and sometimes front-on attacks from the ground. Some attacks can draw blood and the risk of eye injury needs to be taken seriously during magpie swooping season.

Never approach a young magpie. Fledglings that have just left the nest or have fallen out are likely under the watchful eye of a parent. Touching the bird or getting too close can provoke the parent bird as they may think you are a predator. If you believe an infant bird is at risk, contact your local wildlife rescue organisation and they will advise the best course of action.

South Burnett Regional Council has approved the second – and final – stage of the \$450,000 redevelopment of Murgon's QEII Park.

Councillors gave Stage 2 the go-ahead at the SBRC's August General Meeting.

The second stage will cover the area from the rear of the Visitor Information Centre to Krebs Street.

Plans for it were presented to Murgon business representatives at a community engagement meeting held in the park on August 10.

The meeting also gathered local feedback about the first stage of the redevelopment (Gore Street to the front of the VIC) to see what lessons could be learned from it.

One issue that emerged at the community meeting was the large amount of concrete used in the first stage.

Residents said this made the park hot in summer and reduced the amount of grassed areas.

To combat these problems, **the width of footpaths in the second stage will be reduced from three metres to 2.4 metres**, which will still allow wheelchairs, prams and scooters to be used alongside able-bodied pedestrians.

Another Stage 1 issue was the distance between the seats and table tops in the new shelters, which posed difficulties for some people.

Council officers said it would be too expensive to increase the clearance between the seats and table tops on the shelters already installed because they have been cemented into place.

However, they will ensure that the four new shelters planned for the second stage have wider seat clearances.

A third issue was that two of the park's existing fig trees will need to be removed because they are near power lines, Telstra cables and fibre optic cables.

Other features planned for Stage 2 include an area installed with 4m x 4m seat benches in a U-shape so park visitors can have an area where they can sit and chat with friends; planting of new trees throughout the park; and the installation of an irrigation system with pop-up sprinklers and new turf to ensure the park stays green year-round.

A sign will also be erected at the western end of the park and two rock plinths will be installed on the eastern end, with plaques acknowledging government funding contributions to the project.

Work on Stage 2 is expected to begin in early October and should be completed by March, weather permitting.

Bjelke-Petersen Dam Day Use Area Closed for 'A Day at the Dam' Music Festival



Guests of the Bjelke-Petersen Dam Recreation and Caravan Park will still have access to the park boat ramp for launching.



Castra aged care

The 10-year anniversary of the opening of the new Castra aged care building at Murgon was celebrated with a special lunch for residents and guests on Wednesday.

The history of Castra dates back much further (see below) but 2013 marked an important turning point when a modern, new facility was opened by Southern Cross Care (SCC).

Members of the SCC Board travelled from Brisbane to celebrate alongside current residents and staff.

Chief of People & Mission Mike Hart said the new building was opened on September 25, 2013, five years after SCC took over running the facility.

After some short speeches, two of Castra's oldest residents – Mick Purser, who turned 100 earlier this year, and Gladys Birch, who will be 99 in October – cut a special anniversary cake.

Residents, staff and guests then enjoyed a barbecue lunch and live entertainment on the verandah.

Castra currently has 61 residents and 77 staff members.

A commemorative bench to mark the 10-year celebration will be placed out the front of the building.

Mr Hart said SCC currently operates 13 aged care homes across Queensland, including Karinya in Nanango.

Castra is named after the first house built in Murgon, which was constructed by sawmiller Mr G.W. Nutt in 1904.

Nutt called his house 'Castra' ("camp") and the town sprang up around it soon afterwards when the railway arrived in 1906.

In 1988, the original Castra building was moved to the grounds of the Queensland Dairy and Heritage Museum.

When the former Murgon Shire Council built a 32-bed residential aged care complex in Cooper Street in 1978 to provide for the needs of the district's older residents, the Council named the new facility in honour of the pioneer house.

In 2008, control of Castra passed to Southern Cross Care, an initiative begun 43 years ago by the Knights of the Southern Cross.

In 2013, Southern Cross Care opened a modern 66-bed, \$14 million complex on the site.

Competition Seeks Koala Sightings

A program which hopes to discover the best ways to conserve and protect koala populations in the South and North Burnett is offering prizes for koala photographs.

The Burnett Koala Program – organised by the Burnett Catchment Care Association (BCCA) – is the first and only large-scale koala conservation program in the region.

It has been operating since 2021, and its key focus is to develop community activities aimed at supporting the recovery of koalas in the Burnett.

It also hopes to showcase how agriculture and the environment can coexist sustainably to the benefit of communities, the local economy and the environment.

BCCA is running a photo and observation competition to help develop a better understanding of the koala presence across the region.

Local residents can get involved by forwarding sightings of koalas (past or present) to BCCA along with a photo (if available) and information about the

date and location of the sighting.

The competition closes on November 30.

It offers a first prize for the best photo, and a lucky door second prize from all other submitted observations.

The competition is running alongside the development of a baseline dataset about koala population dynamics and health, which involves DNA testing of koala scats which are being collected by community volunteers across the region.

In coming months, this program will also roll out to include school student engagement and STEM-related activities.

BCCA ecologist Misty Neilson said the koala observation program was a unique citizen science data collection project funded by the Federal Government's Koala Conservation and Protection grants in collaboration with WildDNA, Federation University Australia, OWAD Environment (Koala Detection Dogs), Goondicum Pastoral and the Wide Bay Burnett Environment Council.

And with koala breeding season now under way, there's never been a better time to enter the competition!

Farmers rally against renewables in Brisbane

Farmers have rallied against reckless renewables outside Queensland Parliament House, urging Labor to rethink its plans to destroy prime agricultural land and pristine rainforest and animal habitat throughout Queensland.

The farmers, from all different parts of the state, are warning Labor's commitment of \$200 million for wind farm projects in central Queensland, along with plans for the \$14.2 billion Borumba Pumped Hydro and the Forest Wind projects in Wide Bay and a \$12 billion five-gigawatt Pioneer-Burdekin Pumped Hydro Scheme in the Eungella and Pioneer Valley region will have devastating consequences.

Federal Leader of The Nationals David Littleproud said Labor's reckless race to achieve 82 per cent renewables by 2030 needed a Senate Inquiry.

"The Nationals have been attempting to get a Senate Inquiry into renewables because irreversible damage to Queensland's rainforest and wildlife is at risk," Mr Littleproud said.

"The Nationals wholeheartedly standby and support our farmers who are rallying outside Queensland Parliament House. They just want common sense to prevail."

Federal Member for Capricornia Michelle Landry said families in the Eungella and Pioneer Valley were facing an uncertain future, with the Queensland Labor Government forging ahead with plans to flood the region and build the world's biggest hydro project.

"Eungella, best known for its pristine rainforests and platypus, which inhabit the rivers and creeks, will be inundated with two dams forming the top reservoirs," Ms Landry said.

"The energy required to power the hydro plant will require wind turbines and a solar field, while prime farming land will also go under. It's hypocritical of Labor and the Greens to be more than willing to sacrifice the environment in the name of renewable energy."

Federal Member for Wide Bay Llew O'Brien said Wide Bay was the battle ground where local property owners were standing up for their rights and rightfully demanding their voices be heard.

"The Borumba Pumped Hydro and Forest Wind projects and their associated transmission lines will threaten communities from the Fraser Coast to Gympie, and through the South Burnett,

affecting private land holders, natural habitats and remnant vegetation, and governments must listen to the voices of our community," Mr O'Brien said.

Senator for Queensland Matt Canavan said wind and solar companies were running roughshod over our farmers and our landscapes with very little oversight.

"We've been trying to get a Senate Inquiry into how these developments and transmission lines are being managed for months and it's been blocked every time by the Labor-Greens Government," Senator Canavan said.

"Labor needs to be listening to the communities that are being impacted from these decisions rather than the mostly foreign owned renewable companies."

Federal Member for Flynn Colin Boyce said there were many people, not only in the Flynn electorate, but across the country, who were fighting battles against renewable companies.

"This all directly correlates with the fact that the renewable energy sector is proposing huge infrastructure projects to meet Minister Bowen's 82 per cent renewable energy target by 2030," Mr Boyce said.

"These projects are now seen to be having an enormous impact, particularly in rural and regional Queensland, which I outlined in my maiden speech over 12 months ago. I stand with landholders affected by large scale renewable projects."

Katy McCallum from the Kilkivan Action Group said the local community "completely objected" to Labor's plans.

"Our major concern is the destruction of our stunning district and irreparable damage to the environment, where so much amazing flora and fauna live," Mrs McCallum said.

"The Borumba Pumped Hydro project has not met its requirements under social licence and nobody in our area wants it."

Sixth-generation beef grazier and rally MC Glen Kelly said the rally was being held because regional communities felt increasingly anxious.

"Labor's plans are not looking after the environment – they are destroying it," Mr Kelly said.

"The Moah Creek project will see up to 60 275-metre turbines along 300 to 400-metre high mountain ridges.

"These things are huge - the sweep area of the blades is the size of five football fields. The Moah wind factory will clear 654 hectares of vegetation. It'll also need 120 megalitres, or 60 Olympic-sized pools, of water for dust suppression and the concrete foundations. About 23 Olympic-sized swimming pools of concrete will go into the ground and will never be removed.

"We are asking Labor to stop its reckless race, before it's too late."
